JACKSON — Harlow J. Tague, son of Jacob and Peree Poling Tague, was born May 16, 1885 in Shelby county. He was baptized as a youth in the Methodist church. He lived in the Harlan area in his early years and had a snack stand at the Harlan Fair in the quarter stretch for years. He farmed in the Harlan area before moving to a farm in Guthrie County. In the 40's he moved to Washington and was employed in the Gen. Electric Hanford Works plant at Richland, Wash. After retiring he moved to Los Angeles where he made his home until his death May 17, 1974. He had been in ill health for sometime but was able to go out to dinner with his niece, Mr and Mrs Emmett Stadig for his 89th birthday.

He was preceded in death by his parents; sisters - Libbie Rickel; Tina (Harris) Hamilton; ETTY May and Anna Viola Tague; brothers, George, Jim, Fred, William and Robert. Survivors include one sister - Blanche Lawson of Ellensburg, Wash., and many nieces and nephews.

Funeral services were held May 22 at Old North Church at Forest Lawn Memorial Park at Hollywood Hills with Dr. E. Ezra Ellis Officiating. Burial was in the Forest Lawn.
