Mrs. Clara E. Wattier, 96, a resident of the Randolph community for nearly 74 years, passed away on Sunday, April 29 at Colonial Manor in Randolph.

Funeral services were held on Wednesday, May 2 at the St. Frances Catholic church. Rev. Roland Peschel officiated at the Funeral Mass. Interment was in the St. Frances cemetery under the direction of the Johnson Funeral Home.

Clara E., daughter of Charles and Anna Kuhl Book, was born February 16, 1883 at Harlan, Ia. On January 18, 1905 she was married to Clovis Wattier at St. Michael's Catholic church in Harlan. The couple moved to Wayne county shortly after their marriage, where they farmed until their retirement in 1951, when they moved in to Randolph. Mr. Wattier passed away in 1953. Mrs. Wattier had resided at Colonial Manor since April, 1976.

Randolph, Neb. — Clara E. Wattier, daughter of Charles and Anna Kuhl Book was born Feb. 16, 1882 in Westphalia. She died Sunday, April 29, 1979, at the Colonial Manor in Randolph, Nebr., at age 97 years, 2 months and 13 days.

On Jan. 18, 1905 she married Clovis Wattier in St. Michael's church in Harlan. They moved to Wayne county in Neb., shortly afterwards, where they farmed until retiring in 1951 when they moved to Randolph, Neb. Mr Wattier died in 1953.
