The Life Story of —

Rev. Albert F. Wiuff, 76

Rev. Albert Fletcher Wiuff, son of Peter and Maren Gram Wiuff, was born on a farm near Rutland, on July 14, 1898. He died April 21, 1975, at the Friendship Home in Audubon, at age 76 years, 9 months and 7 days. Rev. Wiuff attended country school and grew to adulthood in the Rutland, vicinity. On Nov. 11, 1919 he married Frances Eleanor Olson at the home of her parents, in Canby, Minn. Five children were born to this union. Rev. and Mrs Wiuff were privileged to and Mrs Wiuff were privileged to observe their 55th wedding an-niversary in November of 1974. Rev. Wiuff attended John Fletcher College wind alrended John Freicher College in Oskaloosa graduating in 1922. Rev Wiuff served his first congregation at the Methodist church in Verdi, Minn., the Methodist church in Verdi, Minn., in 1922. He next served for 12 years at the Methodist church in Merstrand, Minn. He first came to Shelby county, in 1937, where he was called to the Merrill's Grove Baptist church at Fiscus. From 1946 to 1954 he promoted and helped build the Danish Baptist Memorial Home in Harlan, lowa, as well as serving as its first administrator.

After completion of the Home in Harlan he moved to the Canby, Minn., area where he and Mrs Wiuff built a new home and began to farm. Shortly thereafter he was called to the minstry again, this time at the Canby Baptist church in Canby, Minn.
