Sister Munda Zimmerman, 84

WESTPHALIA — Sister Munda Zimmerman, O.S.F., daughter of Emil and Bertha Zimmerman, youngest of six children. She died on Vocation Sunday, Oct. 28, 1879 in St. Joseph Convent, Campbellsport, Wis.

A School Sister of St. Francis for 62 years and a teach for more than a half century, Sister Munda, missed only three days, due to illness, from instructing the young. Two of Sister Munda's brothers became priests, both Jesuit missionaries, and three of her sisters, were Franciscan Sisters.

Preceding her in death were: Father Joseph A. ("High Eagle" to the Sioux), 47 years; Father Bernard C., a missionary in British Honduras (Belize), 39 years; Sister Jerome, 50 years; Sister Benita, 61 years; and Sister Emilie, 25 years. Survivors include a brother Peter Zimmerman of Stowe, Ohio, nephews and a niece in religious orders, Father Anthony Zimmerman, S.V.D., Tokyo,; Father Eugene Zimmerman, S.J., Pine Ridge, So Dak.; Brother Michael Zimmerman, S.J., Formosa, Argentina; and Franciscan Sister Irene Zimmerman, Sigmarinen, West Germany, and 17 nephews and nieces.

Funeral Mass were held with Father Aloysius Zimmerman, S.V.D., rector of the Divine Word Seminary, East Troy, Wisc., officiating.
