Harlan - Norman John Anderson, son of Harley and Zeta (Reeder) Anderson, was born June 6, 1916, in Sac City. When he was quite young,

he and his family moved to Dunlap.

June 4, 1939, he married Bernadine Cox at the Congregational Parsonage in Dunlap. He attended Charles City Linotype School, and worked at a Pierce, NE newspaper, and then at the Woodbine Twiner. In 1986, they moved into the Elm Crest Apartments. He was a member of the United Methodist Church in Kirkman, VFW Post #941, and the Des Moines Typographical Union. He died Dec. 10, 1993 at Myrtue Memorial Hospital in Harlan at age 77 years, 6 months, and 4 days.

Preceding him in death were his parents. Survivors include his wife, Bernadine of Harlan; one daughter Madelyne (Paul) Bauer of Anoka, MN; one , brother Mardis Anderson of Richardson, TX; two grandchildren; nieces and nephews.
