

Beulah Mae Bacon, 92

March 27, 1898 — Feb. 14, 1991

HARLAN — Beulah Mae Bacon, daughter of Frank and Elizabeth (Hughes) Pfister, was born March 27, 1898, at Dedham. As a young girl, she moved with her family to Harlan where she graduated from Harlan High School. She then attended college for one year in Chicago before moving to Omaha where she worked for a time.

Jan. 5, 1920, she married Oliver Bacon at Co. Bluffs. Two children were born to this union. After their marriage, they resided in Harlan where she assisted her husband in the Bacon Hardware Store. After she retired in 1972, she remained active in the family business affairs until the time of her death. Oliver died Dec. 24, 1983. She died Feb. 14, 1991, at the Salem Lutheran Nursing Home in Elk Horn, at age 92 years, 10 months and 18 days. In addition to being a member of First United Methodist Church in Harlan, she was a member of the American Legion Auxiliary.

In addition to her parents and husband, she was preceded in death by a daughter, Ann Bocken; two sisters, Mamie Pfister and Mabel Sutton, and a brother, Dale Pfister. Survivors are her son, Max (Muriel) Bacon of Harlan; a son-in-law, Charles Bocken of Honolulu, HI; five grandchildren; seven great grandchildren; nieces and nephews and other relatives.
