## Charles T. Baker, 87

In 1971. he purchased one of the Linebarger Cabins on North Mt. in Bella Vista, AR., later living in a large mobile home nearby in Bella Vista Heights. He was President in 1983 and 1984 of the local Hilltoppers Club, taking an active part in United Fund Drives and Bella Vista Census. He was active with the Vista News T.V. productions, AARP, National

Association of Retired Federal Employees, and Sons of the American Revolution. He was a member of First Federated Church, Des Moines; Bella Vista Baptist Church, Bella Vista, AR., and Grace Baptist Church, Harlan. He moved to Harlan in 1987 and to the Salem Lutheran Home in Elk Horn in 1991.

Survivors include his wife, Lucille; his three children and their spouses, Dick (Shirley) Baker of Lyons, CO.; Curt (Shirley) Baker of Bethany, MO.; and Joyce (Lynn) Petersen of Elk Horn; 12 grandchildren and ten great-grandchildren; a brother, Leon (Lillian) Baker of Ontario, Canada; two sisters, Ethel Allen of Springfield, MA., and Olive Scott of Auburn, N.Y.; nieces, nephews, and other relatives.
