WALNUT — Arlin LeRoy Bornholdt, son of Orville and Margaret Mary Brink Bornholdt, was born March 23, 1933, southeast of Marne on a farm and attended country schools in Shelby county and high school in Walnut.

He married Janet Petersen, Oct. 26, 1957 at the Cass county courthouse. They farmed in Cass and Shelby counties for 27 years. He served in the U.S. Army during the Korean Conflict. He died May 15, 1987 at the Salem Lutheran Nursing Home in Elk Horn at age 54 years.

He was preceded in death by his father; a brother, Everett Bornholdt; a niece and a great nephew. Surviving are his wife, Janet; his mother, Margaret; five brothers, Carl and Donald of Atlantic, Ross and Max of Walnut and Robert of Marne; three sisters, Mrs Wilbert (Janis) Andersen and Mrs John (Helen) Marxen Jr. of Atlantic and Mrs Dewey (Darlene) Hess of Harlan; many nieces and nephews.
