KIMBALLTON - Dagny Louise Breining was born Dec. 1, 1918, northwest of Kimballton. Her parents were Einar and Anna (Nielsen) Rasmussen. She was baptized and confirmed in the Immanuel Lutheran Church in Kimballton. She attended rural school, Jackson #6 and completed 8th grade.

March 8, 1937, she married Earl Breining in the Little Brown Church in Nashua. They moved to MN., where Earl worked on a farm there. Then they came back to Kimballton and worked for Einar Rasmussen and on several neighboring farms. They moved to the Pete Lillehoj farm and then to the home place west of Kimballton where they farmed from 1948-1973. They retired and moved to Elk Horn in 1974. She has worked at the Harlan

Hospital and the Elk Horn Salem Homes. Earl died in Dec. of 1987. She remained in their home until 1989 when she moved to the Five-Plex in Kimballton. She died June 25, 1990 at Myrtue Memorial Hospital in Harlan.

Preceding her in death were one sister, Elna Brewer; one brother, Halvor Rasmussen and one grandson, Christopher Breining. She is survived by two daughters, Muriel (Mrs Lloyd) Petersen of Kimballton and Diane (Mrs Jim) Juelsgaard of Elk Horn; one son, Ronald Breining of Kimballton; 15 grandchildren; 19 great-grandchildren; four sisters, Selma (Mrs Adolph) Breining of Elk Horn; Norma DuVall of Belmont; Irma Desler of Billingham, WA., and Neoma Rasmussen of Vancouver, WA.

Funeral services were held June 28, 1990 in the Immanuel Lutheran Church in Kimballton with Pastor Clayton Nielsen officiating. Burial was in the Immanuel Lutheran cemetery, west of Kimballton. Casketbearers were Tony Petersen, Terry Petersen, Troy Petersen, Trent Petersen, Trace Petersen, Thomas Petersen, John Breining, Jason Juelsgaard and Jarod Juelsgaard.
