HARLAN — Ida Bothilda Brockmann, daughter of Jens and Carrie (Jaspersen) Wolf was born on July 21, 1894 near Exira. She resided with her parents in the Exira and Avoca area and attended country school.

On Feb. 24, 1915, she married Carl Brockmann in Harlan. Nine children were born to this union. They farmed in Shelby county. In 1926, they moved into Harlan. They celebrated their 50th wedding anniversary on Feb. 24, 1965. After Carl died on Nov. 9, 1965, she continued to make her home in Harlan. She became a resident of Baptist Memorial Home on June 5, 1976 and this has been home since that time. She died at the Baptist Home on Jan. 26, 1987, at age 92 years, six months and five days.

On Feb. 3, 1964, she was baptized at the Immanuel Lutheran church in Harlan, where she has been a member for many years. She was a member of the V.F.W. Auxiliary and the Zenobia Rebekah Lodge No. 286, both of Harlan and a past member of the Navy Mother's club.

In addition to her parents and husband, she was preceded in death by a daughter, Doris Ann; two sons, Ernest and Robert; three brothers, Jules, Marion and Albert and one sister, Margaret. She is survived by four sons: Lowell "Bud" of Fairfield Bay, AK.; Lyle of LeMars; Richard "Dick" of Shelby and Dewey of Co. Bluffs; two daughters, Edith White of Omaha, NE. and Viola (Mrs Earl) Butterbaugh of Co. Bluffs; 13 grandchildren and 13 great grandchildren; nieces, nephews and other relatives.

Funeral services were Jan. 29, 1987 at Pauley Funeral Home in Harlan with Pastor Otto Zwanziger and Pastor Paul Olsen of the Immanuel Lutheran church in Harlan, officiating. Burial was in the Harlan cemetery with Dave Wolf, James J. Wolf, Scott Brockmann, Phylip Wolf, Gerald D. Wolf and Gary Butterbaugh serving as casketbearers.
