

Larry Lee Buboltz, 54

Dec. 23, 1937 — July 11, 1992

AVOCA — Larry Lee Buboltz was born in Atlantic, Dec. 23, 1937. He was the son of Don and Hyllis Speaker Buboltz. He attended school for a short time in Ralston, NE., and Atlantic. He completed his schooling in Lewis and graduated in 1956. In 1957 he entered the Air Force until he received his discharge because of his father's health. He helped his father in farming along with renting some land of his own, for a short time, until going to work for Henningsen Construction in Atlantic, building roads and bridges.

He married Judith Fehl Jan. 27, 1962 at Hancock. They were the parents of three children. He started working as a carpenter when he worked for Rader Construction and Gene Olsen Construction, both of Hancock and for Ernest Jensen in Minden. In 1976 he started his own construction business. He was a member of the Trinity Lutheran Church, Fred Funston American Legion Post, where he served as Commander and on the East Pottawattamie County Fair board. He died July 11, 1992, at Myrtue Memorial Hospital in Harlan, at age 54 years, 6 months and 18 days.

He was preceded in death by his father.
