

Edward Bergloff, 87

Feb. 5, 1912 – May 18, 1999

BOONE – Edward Bergloff was born Feb. 5, 1912, in Boone County, son of Theodore and Pauline Nelson Bergloff. He graduated from Kirkman High School.

He married Gladys Nelson in Tekamah, NE, Oct. 25, 1936. He was a heavy duty equipment operator during World War II, working in Alaska helping to build air bases and highways. During the end of World War II he was a welder in the shipyards of Oregon. Later he was a welder for Quinn Iron & Wire in Boone, where he was employed for 12 years and then he worked as a welder for John Deere and Co. in Ankeny for 11 years retiring in 1974. He was a member of Central Christian Church and the U.A.W. Local #450. He died May 19, 1999, of heart failure at the Boone County Hospital at age 87 years.

He was preceded in death by his parents; two brothers, Theodore Bergloff and Robert Bergloff; and a sister, Doris. He is survived by his wife, Gladys Bergloff of Boone; two sons, Jack Bergloff of Warsaw, MO and Larry Bergloff of Kansas City, MO; one daughter, Beverly (Dennis) Bristle of Ogden; one brother, Charles (Bernice) Bergloff of Ogden; one sister-in-law, Josephine Boken of Exira; five grandchildren and four great grandchildren.

Funeral services were held May 22, 1999, at Schroeder Memorial Chapel in Boone, with Rev. Dr. Ron Franklin officiating. Burial was in the Harlan Cemetery. Casket bearers were Teddie Bergloff, Grant Jordon, Steve Bergloff, Alan Hurst, Ty Bergloff and Lyle Canuth.
