

## Thelma Campbell, 74 ✓

**HARLAN** — Thelma Caroline Campbell, the daughter of Edwin and Katherine (Klinkefus) Pulver, was born April 2, 1913, on a farm in Shelby county. She attended school in Harlan graduating with the high school class of 1931. She taught school for a short time in Wichita, IA, before her marriage to Floyd H. Campbell in 1934. Four children were born to this union.

They made their lives together, farming in Shelby and Pottawattamie Counties. They were active members of Monroe Chapel of the United Methodist Church, Farm Bureau, Pork Producers, Beef Producers and in Extension work. After Floyd's death in 1974, she continued to make her home in Walnut where they had moved when they retired from the farm in 1972. Her activities centered around her church, various neighborhood groups, card clubs, W.S.C.S. and the Culture Club. Jan. 6, 1988, she died at her home in Walnut at age 74 years, nine months and 23 days.

In addition to her parents and husband, she was preceded in death by an infant brother, Edwin. She is survived by four children, Carolyn Christensen of Harlan; Richard of Loveland, CO; Jane (Mrs James) Johnson of Boulder, CO and Larry of Webster City; 12 grandchildren; 2 great-grandchildren; one sister, Grace (Mrs Norman) Koos of Mesa, AZ and one sister-in-law, Janice Erett of Ralston, NE and other relatives.

Funeral services were held Jan. 11, 1988 at the First United Methodist Church, Harlan, with Pastor Brian Sherman of the Shelby United Methodist Church officiating. Burial was in the Harlan cemetery with Jeffery Mayne, Rick Campbell, Todd Campbell, Gregory Mayne, Wade Campbell, Andrew Johnson and Robert Campbell serving as casket bearers.
