## Harold Caudill, 69

HARLAN – Harold Forrest Caudill, D.D.S., son of Quincy and Levada Caudill, was born Sept. 5, 1921 in Lockeman, one of nine children. He received his high school diploma in 1940 from Albia High School.

He was also an avid sports fan, and remained a lifelong supporter of the Iowa Hawkeye teams through his involvement with the I booster clubs.
