Harlan - Nellie Viola Christensen, daughter of Nicholas H. and Anne Marie (Hansen) Ohms was born on the family farm in Jackson Twp., Shelby County, June 29, 1903. They were privileged to celebrate their 51st Anniversary in March of 1978. After he died Sept. 26, 1978, she continued to live in her home in Harlan. April 1993 she moved to the Salem Lutheran Retirement Home in Elk Horn. In July 1994 she moved from the retirement home to the nursing home in Elk Horn. She was in failing health for the past several months and died May 29, 1995 at the Salem Lutheran Home at age 91 years and 11 months.
