With the exception of a few places of employment, she spent her married life caring for her family and home. Thomas died Dec. 23, 1984 and she continued to reside at their home in Denison until being flooded out in the July 1993 Flood. Since that time, she had resided with her daughter and husband, Patricia and Francis Murtaugh in Harlan, where her death occurred Feb. 13, 1994 at age 89 years, 5 months and 23 days. She was a member of the St. Rose of Lima

Catholic Church in Denison and the St. Rose Ladies Guild.

including her parents and her husband, she was preceded in death by one granddaughter, Mary Patricia Murtaugh, two sisters, Gusta Danielson and Emma Frank Bolken and two brothers, George and Richard Cassebarth. Survivors include her three children and their spouses, Patricia (Francis) Murtaugh of Harlan, John "Jack" (Judy) Clarey of Denison, and Joseph "Mike" (Patricia) Clarey of Co. Bluffs, ten grandchildren, eight great grandchildren, nieces, nephews and other relatives.
