CLINTON, MD. — Dean Copeland, son of Glenn "Chub" and Dora "Doty" Andersen Copeland was born in Co. Bluffs, Nov. 5, 1929. As a small child, he moved with his parents to Harlan. He was preceded in death by his parents. He is survived by his wife, Mary Jean of Ft. Washington, MD.; three sons, Stephen, Phillip and Kevin all of the Washington D.C. area; two daughters, Jo Jean (Mrs Mike) Stern of Waldorf, MD.; Cynthia (Mrs Kevin) Duncan of Huntsville, AL. and five grandchildren.
