

Floyd Chambers, 80

Feb. 24, 1917 - April 15, 1997

HARLAN - Floyd Vincent Chambers, son of William Everett and Alvina (Oswald) Chambers, was born Feb. 24, 1917, at Minden, NE. He attended school and graduated from Minden Nebraska High School, growing to adulthood on the family farm.

Nov. 17, 1939, he married Phyllis Carstensen at Washington. Two daughters were born to this union. They resided near Harlan where his vocation and avocation was grain and livestock farming. After the death of his wife, April 29, 1959, he continued to reside on the farm near Harlan.

Nov. 25, 1960, he married Kathryn Dryden Johnson in Harlan. They made their home on the farm near Harlan. In 1982, they retired and moved into Harlan. After her death Dec. 6, 1996, he continued to reside in his home in Harlan. He died at the Myrtue Memorial Hospital April 15, 1997 at age 80 years, one month and 22 days. He was a longtime member of the Altamont Baptist Church and currently was a member of the First Baptist Church in Harlan.

In addition to his parents and both of his wives, he was preceded in death by two sisters, Frances Chambers and Ada Peterson; a brother, Wayne Chambers, and a grandson, Greg Mathiasen. He is survived by his daughters, Ann (Norman) Snuttjer of Co. Bluffs and Linda (Ron) Goetzinger of Shelby; his grandchildren, Deborah (Troy) Stogdill of Co. Bluffs; Thomas and Michael Snuttjer of Co.
