He was a former member of the Eagle Club in Red Oak.

In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by a son, Raymond; in 1976, a granddaughter; Kriss Marie Ford, a great grandson, Thomas Charles Cooper, II. a

brother Russell; a sister, Nellie and a son-in-law, Charles Ford.

He is survived by his wife Mildred of Harlan; two daughters, Joyce Ford of Springfield, MO and Candy Perry of Harlan; 16 grandchildren; 20 great-grandchildren; five brothers, David of Red Oak; Roy of La Marque, TX; Ralph of Des Moines; Elmer of Red Oak and John of Lafayette, AL; three sisters, Opal Koons of Dallas, OR; Mary Kennedy of Des Moines; and Erma Jean Varus of Red Oak; nicces and nephews.
