



## Trevor Lee Erickson, 25

July 16, 1968 - Oct. 29, 1993

**HARLAN** - Trevor Lee Erickson, son of Eldon H. and Lesly A. (Hansen), was born July 16, 1968 at Harlan, Iowa. He died October 29, 1993, at Myrtle Memorial Hospital at the age of 25 years, three months and 13 days.

Trevor was injured in an auto accident at the age of four and has been confined to a wheel chair since that time. He had attended preschool in Harlan, Concerned, Inc. and graduated from Harlan Community High School with the class of 1989.

He loved the outdoors and loved to watch things grow. He started numerous plants from seed, such as his banana tree. His hobbies were diversified from gardening, stamp collect-

ing, woodworking, swimming, using the computer and enjoying the many birds and animals. During high school, Trevor was employed by Pizza Hut. He was allowed to keep his shirt and cap because he loved his job there. He had two special friends, Roberta Brandma, who taught him sign language and Edna Smith, his neighbor. Trevor enjoyed traveling and shopping. After a trip to Florida (Disney World, Sea World, and Busch Gardens), he said what he liked best was riding in Uncle Ike's golf cart and riding his cousin Cathy's pony, "Puddin". He was a person who had a great sense of humor and loved to tease, especially his dad. Trevor developed a sensitivity for people and their needs and took his household chores seriously, especially getting the mail. Other interests were studying weather changes and news dealing with the weather, and his relationship and conversations with God.

Trevor was proceeded in death by his paternal grandmother, Sadie Ann Erickson and his maternal grandfather, Orville "Herk" Hansen. He is survived by his parents, Eldon and Lesly A. Erickson of Harlan, his maternal grandmother, Irene Hansen and his paternal grandfather, Floyd A. Erickson, of Harlan.

Funeral services were held Monday, November 1, 1993 at Pauley Funeral Home in Harlan with Rev. Al Hazelton of First Assembly of God Church in Harlan officiating. Burial was in Harlan Cemetery with Tracy Erickson, Mark Hansen, Dan Marku, Steve Philson, James Sparks and Jeff Hansen as casket bearers.
