## Norman Gene Ingwers, 55

Kimballton - Norman Gene Ingwers, son of Fred and Margaret Lois (Davis) Ingwers was born Jan. 28, 1939 at Corley in Shelby, Co. He was baptized Feb. 7, 1942 at the First Lutheran Church in Avoca and graduated from Audubon High School in 1957. Jan. 8, 1959 he entered the United States Army. After his honorable discharge on March 8, 1962, he returned to the Shelby County area where he worked for Francis Plumb in the well digging and tiling business.
