HARLAN — Julius Jensen, son of Nels and Karen (Christensen) Jensen was born July 8, 1900, on a farm in Pottawattamie County, in the Hancock-Avoca area, and was one of 14 children in his family. He attended country

school, and grew to adulthood on his parents farm.

Feb. 2, 1929, he married Nellie Hulsebus at the Evangelical United Brethren Church Personage in Defiance. Seven children were born to this union. After their marriage, they farmed north of Defiance for eight years. They then moved to the Irwin-Kirkman area where they farmed until Aug. of 1972, when they moved into Harlan. After the death of his wife Feb. 13, 1973, he continued to reside in his home in Harlan, and in the spring of 1974, he married Christie Larson of Harlan. After her death in the fall of 1974, he resided in his own home until Aug. of 1989, when he became a resident of the Baptist Memorial Home in Harlan, It was there that he died March 2, 1992, at age 91 years, 7 months, and 23 days. He was a member of First United Methodist Church in Harlan.

In addition to his parents and wives, he was preceded in death by his brothers and sisters, Kriss, Carl, Nels, Anton, John, Berg, Sievert, Marie Christina, Kathryn, Eva Kay, and two infants. Surviving are five sons, Gerald of Sioux City; Daryl of Harlan; Virgil of Loveland, CO.; Larry of Mentor, OH., and Don of Macedon, N.Y.; two daughters, Marilyn Stamp of Omaha, NE., and Karen Brockelsby of Kenner, LA.; 16 grandchildren and 7 great-grand-
