Alma Mae Koenig, daughter of Nels and Mary Togerson Jacobsen, was born Oct. 12, 1904 near Hancock. She received her education there and on May 28, 1927, she married Henry Koenig. They farmed in the Avoca and Hancock areas and operated dance halls in Avoca and Hancock. Their last farming had been done in Shelby county north of Walnut and they moved to Walnut in 1972.

She was a member of Peace United Church of Christ, the Walnut Federated Garden club and the Monday Night club. She died Nov. 10, 1986 at age 82 years of injuries she received when the car she was driving went out of control on an icy road south of Walnut and slide head-on into a tractor.

She was preceded in death by her husband; a daughter, Agnes; a son, Russell; her parents; and four brothers, Pete, Fred, Ed and Hans Jacobsen.
