



## Rose A. Pauley, 91

**CALIFORNIA, MO.** — Rose Ann Pauley, daughter of John and Mary (Reinig) Pitsch was born July 25, 1899, at Portsmouth. She was baptized and confirmed at St. Mary's Catholic Church in Portsmouth.

June 9, 1926, she married Theodore Pauley at St. Mary's Catholic Church in Portsmouth. They were the parents of nine children. After their marriage, she taught school for two years, and then helped her husband on the farm near Portsmouth and raised her family. After the death of Ted Sept. 17, 1977, she continued to live on the farm until 1979, when

she moved to Portsmouth. In Nov. of 1986, she moved to California, MO., where she made her home with her daughter, Grace. It was there that she died March 13, 1991, at age 91 years, seven months, and 16 days.
