

Lowell M. Paulson, 76

July 22, 1919 - May 17, 1996

JACKSONVILLE BEACH, FL - Lowell M. Paulson was born July 22, 1919 in Harlan, son of Nels and Dorthea (Sorensen) Paulsen. He graduated from Harlan High School. He also taught in the rural Shelby Co. Schools. He served in the U.S. Army during WW II and received the Purple Heart as one of the first combat infantrymen to cross the bridge of Ramagun in Germany. He also received the Good Conduct Medal, WW II Victory Medal, European-African Middle Eastern Service Medal and the American Theater Service Medal. He was chief of property management for the Veteran's Administration for 32 years. He retired in 1975 to travel the United States in his motor home and to visit his parent's homeland of Denmark. He died May 17, 1996 at the Baptist Medical Center Beaches at age 76.

He is survived by his wife of 57 years, Maxine (Curtis); their three children, Sharon Metzger of Elma, NY; David Paulson of Melbourne, FL and Dr. Sandra Adams of Charwater, FL; six grandchildren and seven great grandchildren.

Funeral services were held May 21, 1996 with full military honors at the Greentown Cemetery in Jacksonville, FL.
