

HARLAN - Ray Evan Pleak, son of Charles and Maurine (Latimer) Pleak, was born May 27, 1945, at Red Oak. He was baptized and confirmed at First Christian Church there, and graduated from Red Oak High School. He then attended lowa State University, graduating with degrees in Animal Science and Doctor of Veterinary Medicine in 1970.

June 20, 1970, he married Shari Muller at Defiance. They became the parents of three children. After their marriage, he was employed in small animal veterinary practice in Des Moines from 1970 to 1972 and then practiced in two different large animal veterinary practices in Harlan from 1972 to 1992. He has remained active in many community activities since that time. He was a member of First Christian Church as a child and was a 20 year member of the United Methodist Church in Defiance. He presently at-tended First Baptist Church in Harlan. He was a board member and president of Southwest I.V.M.A. and a member of Public Relations and Sheep Committee of lowa V.M.A. He was also a member of the Dean's Advisory Committee to the College of Veterinary Medicine, lowa State University, a member of the Shelby County Board of Health, and treasurer, and trustee of the of Health, and treasurer and trustee of the Defiance United Methodist Church. He coached little league, was a 4-H club leader and was a board member and president of the Harlan Community School District from 1991 to 1995. Ray died at his home in Harlan Sept. 9, 1996, at age 51 years, three months and 13 days.
