She was a past matron of Eastern Star of which she was a member for more than sixty-five years, holding various offices, past Grand Organist and District Instructor for Eastern Star. She was past president of the lowar Federation Music Clubs and held many offices in the lowa Music Teachers Association. She served as organist for over twenty-five years at the Congregational Church in Harlan and was the accompanist for Harlan's "Messiah", July 12, 1986 the city of Harlan observed "Ruth Potter Day" to honor a piano teacher of nearly sixty-six years then. She had been a resident of Salem Lutheran Nursing Home in Elk Horn for the past two years. She died at Jennie Edmundson Hospital in Co. Bluffs Sept. 9, 1995 at age eighty-nine years, nine months and twenty days.
