Died Sun., July 3 west of Harlan -

Throlson third fatality on Shelby County roads

Jarold Throlson, 21, Harlan, died in a one car accident three miles west of Harlan on Hwy 44 at 10:30 a.m., Sunday, July 3. He became the third person to die in a car-related accident this year in Shelby County and the eighth traffic fatality in the state over the Fourth of July holiday weekend.

Throlson, according to Sheriff's Deputy Mark Kaufman, was driving his 1976 AMC Pacer three miles west of Harlan in the westbound lane of Hwy 44, when he lost control of the vehicle and struck a concrete bridge

Throlson was trapped inside the vehicle and died at the scene, according to County Coroner, Dr. R.

Duane Harris.

Also at the scene of the accident were Shelby Co. Sheriff Gene Cave-

naugh, Deputy Chief Mark Hervey and MediVac Ambulance. Deputy Kaufman said the Harlan Fire Dept, was called after gas was observed leaking from Throlson's vehicle.

Traffic was re-routed for three hours Sunday morning as investigators reviewed the accident site and removed the vehicle.

SURVIVORS

Throlson, a construction worker at Sta-Bilt Road Construction Co. and had attended Harlan Community High School, is survived by his wife, Susan; son Derek, 2; mother, Carol Ann Throlson, Shelby; sister, Wyvette (Bill) Kimmen, Whitman Air Force Base (MO) and a brother, Thomas, Shelby.

Maternal grandparents, Mr and Mrs Harold Hull, Harlan; father and mother-in-law, Steve and Rose Brandenburg, Maquoketa. Throlson's death marks the third fatality on Shelby County roads this year. David Graeve, 9, Defiance, was killed on Feb. 28 when he was struck while playing on a bridge one-half mile south of Defiance on 'old Hwy 59.'

David Wingert, 20, Harlan, died Sun., June 12 following a motorcycle-car accident one and one-half miles south of Harlan on Hwy 59.
