## Edward (Mike) Tolle, 60 /

REDLINE – Edward Milton Tolle, son of Jesse and Sereta Wilson Tolle, was born Jan. 17, 1931, on a farm west of Persia. He attended Yorkshire country school, south of Persia and grew to adulthood on his parents farm.

Jan. 1, 1953, he married Beverly Dent at the Harlan Church of Christ. Two children were born to this union. Feb. 10, 1953, Mike as he was known, was inducted into the U.S. Army, where he served his country in Korea where he received the National Defense Service Medal, United Nations Service Medal, Korean Service Medal, the Good Conduct Medal and the Republic of Korea Presidential Unit Citation for assisting in the dismantling of mine fields. After receiving his discharge from active service Nov. 30, 1954, he was transferred to the U.S. Army reserve where he continued to serve for 8 years.
