

Louis F. Troll, 97

WALNUT — Louis Frederick Troll was born in Monroe Township, Shelby County on Oct. 15, 1890. He was the son of William and Amalia Kindt Troll. He was one of six children in the family. He attended country school in Shelby County. He enlisted in the Army during 1918 and was stationed in France with an infantry unit. He was discharged in 1919.

He married Anna Boringraeber on Nov. 26, 1919 at Shelby. They made their home in Monroe twp., where they farmed. They retired from farming and moved into Walnut in 1964. He was a member of the Peace United Church of Christ in Walnut and also a member of the Walnut American Legion Post No. 422. He has been in failing health the past several years and he was taken to the Cass County Memorial hospital in Atlantic on Sunday and he died Dec. 10, 1987 at age 97 years.

He was preceded in death by his parents, two sisters, Anna Arentsen and Clara Anstine and



one brother, Otto Troll. He is survived by his wife, Anna; two brothers, William Troll of Minden and Herman Troll of Walnut; many nieces, nephews and other relatives.

Funeral services were Dec. 13, 1987 at the Peace United Church of Christ in Walnut with Rev. Michelle Scott and Rev. Wayne Selsor, officiating. Burial was in the Walnut cemetery with Louie M. Troll, Ron Mullenger, Wilbur Auerbach, Duane Errett, Wayne Petersen and Marlyn Troll serving as casketbearers.
