She then lived in Des Moines for a short time and has been a resident of the Baptist Memorial Home in Harlan since 1992. She died at the Baptist Home Aug. 2, 1994 at age 89 years, 9 months and 29 days.

She was preceded in death by her parents, her husband Joseph and her live sisters. She is survived by her son, Dr. Jerome "Jerry" Trout of

Chicago, IL, nieces, nephews and other relatives.
