WESTPHALIA - Leander 'Lee' Zimmerman, son of Frank and Cecilia (Schiltz) Zimmerman was born on a farm east of Westphalia on Nov. 1, 1925. He died in his farm home north of Harlan on June 22, 1988 at age 62 years, seven months and 21 days.
