Deceased was a daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Charles Roach and was aged 38 years. She leaves a husband and five children. The funeral will be held tomorrow at 1 o'clock and interment will take place at Pleasant Ridge Cemetery.

Misc.

In Polk Co., Iowa there is a probate #4006 for guardianship of the five minor children of Elizabeth Chapman. They were Lloyd, Pearl, Charles, Hazel and Fay.

Hazel was living with a family by the name of Johnson and working in part to support herself by May of 1906.

Fay and Charles were with Grandmother Chapman and Hazel was with grandmother Roach in May of 1905.

Elizabeth Chapman had about 190 acres of land in Madison Co., Iowa

The person that was renting the farm lost most of the crops to weeds. Grandmother Roach got 1/3 of the rent and the kids got 1/5 per each child from the remaining 2/3.

By June of 1904 Lloyd and Pearl were both married. Pearl was married to a Devine.

In 1903 their father Charles had an accident and broke both of his arms.

In October of 1900 Charles E. Chapman was guardian of his children and brought suit against Amelia wanting money for the care of the kids. He started west with the kids and became ill before he got out of the state. It was ordered that he be removed as guardian of the children.

The house burned in 1897. The son Charles went to Colorado on December 17, 1909. Charles, Sr. the father is buried in Woodland Cemetery. When Charles died he was buried in Woodland Cemetery.
