Obituary

[Indianola Weekly Herald, Thursday, January 4, 1894]

Mrs. Marcus Miller died December 23. She was born in 1823 in the state of Tennessee and was married in 1840 to Marcus Miller; she was the mother of 13 children, 7 of whom are now living – four daughters and three sons, all married excepting one son. Mrs. Miller was a member of the M. E. church for over forty years. The funeral services were held at the Pleasant Ridge Church and were conducted by Rev. Baily of Des Moines. She was then laid to rest in the cemetery adjoining; the aged husband and the children and grandchildren are left to mourn her loss.
