Eliza Ann Fletcher, daughter of Joseph and Hannah Fletcher, was born in England, August 31, 1859, and died at her home near Orillia, Iowa, May 29, 1936, at the age of 76 years, 8 months and 29 days. She came with her parents to Pennsylvania when she was 7 years of age in 1866.

When she was 18 she was married to Henry Packard. About a year afterwards he was accidentally killed in a coal mine, leaving a child three weeks old.

She and her brother, Charles, came to Des Moines, Iowa, in 1879, when she was 20 years of age. About 1886 she was married to Richard Crane. He died about two years after they were married. Later she married Jonas Webb who preceded her in death 11 years ago.

Mrs. Webb united with the Methodist Episcopal church in Orillia in 1909, where she held her membership until the time of her death.

She leaves to mourn her loss three children, two daughters and one son, as follows: Mrs. L. E. King, Pasadena, Calif.; Mrs. Robert Frey, Madrid, Iowa, and Homer Webb of Orillia, and 19 grandchildren. Five children preceded her in death. One son died during the war in Camp Oglethorpe in Georgia at the age of 23. She also leaves three brothers and one sister, William of Baldwin Park, Calif., Charles of Orillia and Robert and Mrs. Anna Burson of Indianola, Iowa, and a large number of other relatives and friends.

Mrs. Webb lived in the same home for 52 years. She was a pioneer of the Orillia community and with other pioneers she experienced the hardships of the early settlers and witnessed all of the changes of our modern life during the last half century.

Mrs. Webb was a good wife, mother and neighbor and interested always in the better things of life. Her life was well lived.

The funeral sermon was preached by the Rev. A. N. Simpson, pastor of the Norwalk Church of Christ. The services were held in the home. Interment was in the Orillia cemetery.

#### Mother of Mrs. Robert Frey Dies in Orilla

Mrs. Jonas Webb, mother of Mrs. Robert Frey, died at her home near Orilla, Iowa, May 29<sup>th</sup>, at the age of 76 years, 8 months and 29 days. She was a native of England and emigrated with her parents to Pennsylvania when 7 years old, and where she was married to Henry Packard at the age of 18. Her husband was killed one year later, leaving her with an infant child. In 1879, when she was 20, she and a brother came to Des Moines, where in 1886 she was married to Richard Crane. He passed on two years later. She was later married to Jonas Webb who died 11 years ago.

She is survived by three children and nineteen grandchildren; three brothers and one sister. One son died during the World War, in service.

She was a member of the Methodist Church at Orilla and lived in one home 52 years. She had visited her daughter here many times and had many friends here.
