AUDUBON – Albert Charles Dorscher, son of Martin and Sophia Niemann Dorscher, was born April 25, 1909 in rural Avoca, and died Sept. 12, 1991 at his home in Audubon, at age 82 years, 4 months and 7 days. he was raised in rural Avoca and attended rural schools there.

July 8, 1932, he married Rose Killion in Maryville, MO. He farmed around the Avoca and Shelby areas. He retired from farming in 1972 and moved to Co. Bluffs, where he took care of the Dodge House for five years. In 1977 he retired and they moved to Harlan. In 1990 they moved to the Friendship Village in Audubon.

Preceding him in death were his parents; five brothers and sisters. Survivors include his wife, Rose Dorscher of Audubon; his children, Nancy (Craig) Kulla of Audubon; Dixie (Fred) Larsen of Spearfish, S.D.; Charles (Cecile) Dorscher of Salt Lake City, UT.; 3 grandchildren; his sister, Meta Lenhardt of Walnut; several nieces and nephews.
