## **Kenneth A. "Bud" Feser, 70**

**DEFIANCE** – Kenneth Feser, son of Anton and Elizabeth (Dressen) Feser, was born Feb. 3, 1919, on a farm near Defiance. He died at Rose Vista Nursing Home in Woodbine, Feb. 19, 1989 at age 70 years and 16 days.

He was baptized, received his First Communion, and was confirmed at St. Peter's Catholic Church, Defiance, attended St. Paul's School and country school and then farmed with his parents. During WW II, he served his country in the U.S. Army and received the good conduct medal. After WW II, he lived and worked in Omaha as a custodian at Swift and Co. and University Hospitals. He retired at age 62, then made his home with his brother, Jim in Defiance. He was a member of St. Peter's Catholic Church in Defiance, and a member of the American Legion, Post #707, Defiance.

He was preceded in death by his parents and one brother, Charles. He is survived by three brothers, Norbert and James of Defiance and John "Jack" of Denton, TX and eight sisters, Grace (Mrs Edward) Tremel of Panama; Ruth (Mrs Leo) Gross of Earling; Betty (Mrs Otis) Frazier of Dunlap; Arlene (Mrs Gary) Michael of Woodbine; Maxine (Mrs Bernard) Klein of Audubon; Marie Schmitz of St. Louis, MO; Virginia (Mrs Clarence) Goerers of Defiance and Velma (Mrs Lawrence) Fuhmann of Livermore; nieces, nephews and other relatives.
