LOGAN — Lulu Esta Fountain was born July 16, 1911 to Rodney and Lulu Knass Pitt on a farm in Cass Twp. She attended Banner School in Cass twp. through the elementary grades and graduated from Logan Public High School May 24, 1929, with a Normal Training Certificate. She taught over 16 years in Harrison County Rural Schools and kindergarten in Logan the last 14 years of her teaching career until her retirement in May, 1976. She confessed her faith in Jesus Christ as her Lord and Savior when a freshman in high school and was baptized by Rev. L.L. Chamnese Minister of the Christian Church at Logan.

July 23, 1931, she married Earl R. Fountain of Logan. To this union four daughters were born, Beverly Jean, Ruth Lavonne, Vonda Lucille and Joyce Elaine. They moved to Logan after farming for about 15 years. She started back teaching in 1946 when there was a shortage of teachers. She resigned in 1956 from teaching and worked for Harrison County Co-op, candling and grading eggs one year, then in the office a year until the fall of 1958 when she went back teaching. She died March 28, 1992 in the Mo. Valley Hospital.

Preceding her in death were her husband, Earl; two daughters, Ruth Lavonne and Vonda; two sisters, Stella Shreeves and Bessie Harter and three brothers, Ted, Everette and Lawrence Pitt. Survivors are Beverly (Dwight) Weed of Lewisville, TX.; Joyce (Robert) Stahl of Harlan; five grandchildren; and seven great-grandchildren; three sisters, Nellie Meier of Logan; Arlene Hall of Woodbine and Alice Jorgensen of Harlan; two brothers, William Carroll of Woodland, CA., and Merle Pitt of Harlan; several nieces and nephews.
