Edith V. Frazier, 81 ✓

Jan. 28, 1911 — Feb. 12, 1992

DENISON — Edith V. Frazier was born on a farm near Defiance in Greeley Twp., Shelby county, Jan. 28, 1911, the daughter of August A. and Amelia Dorothy Gessman Hulsebus. She was baptized when she was an infant at the E.U.B. Church in Defiance. Her childhood years were spent in the rural Defiance area where she received her elementary education, she graduated from Defiance High School.

Dec. 12, 1928, she married Irwin F. Frazier at her parents home at Defiance. Their union was blessed with one son, Lyle. They made their home in the Defiance and Manilla area where they farmed for 40 years before moving to Denison in 1967. Irwin died Aug. 18, 1974, and she contin-

ued to reside in Denison. Feb. 12, 1975, she was appointed site manager for the Senior Citizen's congregate meals, seeing that organization grow to it's present location at the Crawford County Senior Center. She held that position until she retired Jan. 9, 1987. In 1981, she was selected as Outstanding Senior Citizen for Crawford County by the North Iowa Area Agency On Aging. Following her retirement she remained in her home in Denison. She was taken to Clarkson Hospital in Omaha, NE., four weeks ago and it was there that she died Feb. 12, 1992, at age 81 years and 14 days.

During her years as a member of the E.U.B. Church in Defiance, she served as pianist and organist, taught Sunday school, and was secretary/treasurer of the Missionary Society. Since 1989, she had been a member of the Denison Baptist Church. During the years on the farm she served as the Nishna Valley correspondent for several area newspapers.

Besides her parents and husband, she was preceded in death by three brothers; one in infancy, Dale and Lloyd Hulsebus. She is survived by one son, Lyle (Ruth) Frazier of Denison; 4 grandchildren; 5 great grandchildren, and two brothers, Donald (LaVonne) Hulsebus of Denison and Vernon (Esther) Hulsebus of Carroll; nieces, nephews and other relatives.

Funeral services were held Feb. 14, 1992 at the Denison Baptist Church with Rev. Brian W. Perry, officiating. Casketbearers were Wayne Frazier, Steve Frazier, Randy Goslar, Dean Hulsebus, Jack Hulsebus, Ed Fink, Jeff Petersen, and Steve Neppi. Burial was in the Union twp. cemetery at Defiance.
