

Floyd E. Fiscus, 97 ✓

EARLING - Floyd Errol Fiscus, son of Emery N. and Laura E. (Wright) Fiscus, was born Oct. 31, 1900, at Coal City, IN. He accepted Christ and was baptized in June of 1914 in the river at the Cumberland Mountains in Tennessee and has lived a Christian life since that time. He moved with his parents in 1908 to Kirkman, and lived most of his life in Shelby County. He worked for the city of Harlan by reading meters and assisted the city clerk. For many years he operated Fiscus Ice and Produce Company with his brother, George. He also worked for the Nishna Valley REC. He was a 50 year member of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows Lodge No. 267 of Harlan. He was a member of Grace Baptist Church in Harlan.

Floyd married Mary E. Kennedy Aug. 6, 1925. She preceded him in death in 1974. He lived alone until May 8, 1982, when he married Mildred Lorenz in Harlan, where they lived until August 1993, and have since resided at Little Flower Haven. He died May 29, 1998, at Myrtue Memorial Hospital at age 97 years, six months and 29 days.

In addition to his parents and his first wife, Mary, he was preceded in death by his brothers, Everett, Virgil and George. Survivors include his wife, Mildred Fiscus of Earling; his sister-in-law, Edith Berg of Audubon; his niece, Marjorie Chambers of Hamlin; his nephews, Larry (Linda) Fiscus of Houston, TX and Gerald Fiscus of El Centro, CA; and other relatives.
