

## Glenn W. Hindman, 93

*July 26, 1906 – Jan. 15, 2000*

**AUDUBON** – Glenn William Hindman, son of Frank and Alice Moore Hindman, was born July 26, 1906 at his parents' home in Palmer, NE, and died Jan. 15, 2000, at the Audubon County Memorial Hospital in Audubon, at age 93 years, five months and 19 days. He attended the Free Methodist Church. He attended rural schools near Palmer, NE, and attended Palmer High School. He then attended barber school in Omaha, NE, and was employed as a barber in Omaha for a short time, then worked as a mechanic. He starting farming and came to Melville Township in Audubon County to pick corn.

March 7, 1928, he married Esther G. Heiken in Des Moines. They moved to Palmer and farmed with his father for one year before purchasing a farm in Belgrade, NE. In 1938 they moved to Melville Township and farmed there until he purchased a farm in Hamlin Township near Exira in 1947. In 1970, he purchased the family farm near Palmer, NE, which he operated for 11 years and then sold the farm and purchased a farm in Douglas Township in Audubon County, which he operated until he retired. He lived on his farm near Exira until he became a resident of the Friendship Home in Audubon Dec. 10, 1999. He was a member of the Farm Bureau.

Preceding him in death were his parents; his sisters, Pearl Doyel, Ruby Wolfe and Thelma Morton; and his brother, Wayne Hindman. Survivors include his wife, Esther Hindman of Audubon; his children, Betty (Virgil) Henriksen of Audubon; LaVerne (Margaret) Hindman of Springfield, MO; his grandchildren, Alan Henriksen of Audubon; John and JoEllen Henriksen; Amy Hindman and her friend, Tim Barry, all of Omaha, NE; Scott and Theresa Cloninger of Fremont, CA; Mark Cloninger of Springfield, MO; two great grandchildren; his brother-in-law and sisters-in-law, Clarence (Hans) (Catherine) Heiken of Audubon and Mabel Oliver of Scottsdale, AZ; nieces, nephews and other relatives.
