# Louise Jeanne Mayhugh, 75 ✓

Nov. 21, 1918 - May 11, 1994

**Harlan** - Louise Jeanne Mayhugh, daughter of Louis John and Helena (Busse) Bunge, was born in Avoca Nov. 21, 1918. She grew up in Avoca, and graduated Valedictorian of her high school class in 1936. She attended Capitol City Commercial College in Des Moines and then worked for Columbia Pictures.

July 2, 1938, she married Charles Mayhugh in Kansas City, MO. Charles was employed by the Federal Soil Conservation Service. In 1939, the couple moved to Milwaukee, WI and then to Harlan in 1942. He served in the U.S. Navy, and after his return in 1946, she began working for Dr. Charles Huntley in Avoca. She worked for Dr. Huntley for 20 years. In their later years, they farmed the Shelby County land that Jeanne's grandfather, John Henry Bunge, settled prior to the founding of Avoca. She continued to manage the farm activities following Charles' death Feb. 2, 1989. She was a member of Peace Lutheran Church in Harlan. She died May 11, 1994, at her home in Harlan, at age 75 years, 5 months, and 20 days.

Preceding Jeanne in death were her parents; her husband, Charles; and one sister. Survivors include two children and two grandchildren.

Funeral services were held May 14, 1994, at Peace Lutheran Church with Rev. Edmund Schafer of Immanuel Lutheran Church, Logan, officiating. Casket bearers were Pam Rodger, Virgil Hilsabeck, Sabre Mayhugh, Charles Mayhugh, Merlene Ostebee, and Paul Christensen. Burial was in Graceland cemetery, Avoca.
