



## Samuel Boise Mushrush, 95

**HARLAN** — Samuel Boise Mushrush, son of Michael and Eliza Woods Mushrush, was born April 12, 1892 at Audubon. He was

raised and educated in Audubon.

On Oct. 20, 1915, he married Margaret Mikkelsen at Audubon and had been married over 71 years. He worked as a lineman for Iowa Public Service for many years before coming to Harlan. He was employed by Harlan Municipal Utilities for 45 years; he retired in 1968. He was a member of the Immanuel Lutheran Church, Rebekah Lodge, a 60 year member of the Odd Fellows Lodge and played in the Harlan City Band for many years. He died July 15, 1987 at the Salem Lutheran Nursing Home in Elk Horn, where he had been a resident since May of 1986, at age 95 years, 3 months and 2 days.

He was preceded in death by his parents; six brothers: Joseph, Michael, George, James, Robert and William; seven sisters: Addie Timunons, Frances Andrews, Kate Sheets, Emma Hollingsworth, Jess Johnson, Beulah Mushrush and Fern Curtis. Survivors include his wife, Margaret of Elk Horn; son, Emmert of Harlan; two daughters: Kathleen (Mrs Clay) Christensen of Columbus, NE; and Edith (Mrs James R.) Frazier of Omaha. He is also survived by seven grandchildren; five great-grandchildren, many nieces and nephews.
