

## **Helen I. Mosier, 83**

**Oct. 10, 1914 - Oct. 27, 1997**

**MANCHESTER, MO** - Helen Irene Kirschbaum was born Oct. 10, 1914, the third daughter of William Kirschbaum and Loa Shannon Kirschbaum. The family lived on a farm in Greeley Township, Shelby County, IA. Her father, Bill, had purebred Aberdeen Angus cattle and the girls showed the cattle at various livestock exhibitions including Aksarben. Helen attended rural school in Greeley Township and graduated from the Kirkman High School and then beautician school. She was a hairdresser for many years in Omaha.

In February of 1937 she married Bill Mosier. He worked for the Union Pacific Railroad. They were the parents of one daughter, Sharon, born Oct. 2, 1944. Following retirement, they moved to Kimberling City, MO on Table Rock Lake where she became interested in antiques and made this her second vocation. Bill died in March 1992. Helen moved to Manchester, MO to be closer to her daughter. She died Oct. 27, 1997, at age 83.

She was preceded in death by her grandparents; parents; her husband, Bill; and a sister, Mildred (John) Herman, July 1991. She is survived by her daughter, Sharon Platt; two granddaughters, Shannon and Shawn; a sister, Adeline (Tony) Appel of LaMar, MO; nieces, nephews and other relatives.
