May 9, 1915 - Nov. 18, 1999

OMAHA, NE - Elizabeth Lucille Nagel, daughter of Beulah Gale (Kidd) and Glenn Mansfield Breedlove, was born May 9, 1915, in Maryville, MO. She attended school in Maryville.

She married Ether Parke Marshall in 1930. To this union, three children were born. She moved, originally, to Harlan in 1953. She worked several years at Farmer's Department Store in ladies' ready-to-wear. Later, she was co-owner of the Saylor Hotel Coffee Shop. After moving to Omaha in 1958 she opened and managed three different Tober Stores, again ladies' ready-to-wear. In 1975, she moved back to Harlan and owned and operated a women's retail store entitled, "The Loft" for nine years. Due to health problems, she retired in 1985 and returned to Omaha. In addition to her occupation, she participated in and was a 50 year member of Eastern Star serving at one time as Worthy Matron. She died Nov. 18, 1999, at age 84 years, six months and nine days at the Montclair Nursing and Rehabilitation Center in Omaha, NE. She had been a resident there since 1998.

She was preceded in death by her parents. She is survived by her children, Parke Marshall (Jeneane) of Bettendorf; Richard Marshall (Joane) of Hawaii and Sue (George) Petsche of Harlan; seven grandchildren; 20 great grandchildren; one great great grandchild and other relatives.
