CUMBERLAND — Keith Eugene Namanny was born Sept. 17, 1951, at Jennie Edmundson Hospital in Council Bluffs, son of Eugene C. and LaDonna R. (Jones) Namanny. He grew up in Walnut, and lived there until moving to Cumberland in 1966. He graduated from the Massena High School in 1969.

Later, Keith lived in Grand Island, NE where he met Marla, his future wife. They married in 1976 and moved to Duluth, MN where they owned and operated a waterbed business. While in Duluth, their two daughters were born, Jennifer in 1977 and Melissa in 1979. The family moved back to Cumberland in 1985 where they have resided since. Keith was a partner in the Namanny Sports and Entertainment Company in Atlantic. He was a member of the Seventh Day Adventist Church in Atlantic. He died Dec. 26, 2005, at his home at age 54.
