**Attend funeral at  
Arlington National  
Cemetery**

Army Sgt. Donald Noehren, a 1945 graduate of Harlan High School, died in 1951 in a POW camp during the Korean War. He had been listed as MIA until recently.

His remains were identified by DNA analysis, and were returned to Washington, DC, April 1, when 28 relatives met the plane carrying the casket. Among those relatives were his niece, Pat Chipman; his nephew, Rick and Cheryl Chipman; and their sons, Jerad Chipman of Sugar Grove, IL, and Adam Chipman of Harlan. Visitation was held Sunday afternoon, and in the evening, the relatives all went out to dinner together. Monday afternoon, they all attended the funeral at Arlington National Cemetery. While in Washington, DC, Rick, Cheryl, Jerad, and Adam went sightseeing and visited museums, including the WWII Museum. They saw the Washington Monument, the WWII Monument, the Korean War Monument, Lincoln Memorial, and the Vietnam War Memorial. Rick, Cheryl, and their sons returned to their homes April 4.
