



## Gladys Reynolds, 95

**HARLAN** - Gladys Ciscely Paup Reynolds was born Nov. 4, 1894 at Union, NE., the daughter of Ira C. and Ciscely (Burcham) Paup. Her mother died Nov. 12, 1894, eight days after her birth. Her grandparents, John and Jane (Chatburn) Burcham then brought her to Harlan and raised her as one of their children. Her great-grandparents were John and Mrs. Thomas W. Chatburn. She attended the Newby Country School just east of Harlan, and as a girl was baptized in the Latter Day Saints faith.

Dec. 22, 1914 she married Clede Reynolds at her aunt, Walter

McCoy's in Harlan. One son, George was born to this union. He lived only a few hours. They lived on the Reynolds home place west of Defiance until 1917, when they moved into Defiance. In 1918, they moved to Hancock, and in 1920 moved to Dunlap where they farmed. Feb. of 1929, they moved to Harlan, and it was there that Clede died on March 9, 1972. She continued to make her home in Harlan and on Feb. 3, 1984, she became a resident of the Baptist Memorial Home. It was there that she died on Sept. 21, 1990, at age 95 years, 10 months and 17 days.

She was a member of First Christian Church in Harlan. She became a member of the Golden Crown Rebekah Lodge in Dunlap in 1925, and after she moved to Harlan in 1929, she transferred her membership to Zenobia Rebekah Lodge, No. 286. She had held several offices in this lodge. From 1966 to 1967, she was Chaplain of the Rebekah Assembly of Iowa, and she had held several other appointed state offices, including the Decoration of Chivalry for her work and faithfulness in the Harlan and State Lodges.

She was preceded in death by her parents; her son, George and her husband. She is survived by her cousins. Funeral services were held Sept. 25, 1990, at Pauley Funeral home in Harlan with Rev. Don Schoepf of First Christian Church, officiating. Burial was in Union Twp. in Defiance with Dar Lund, Max Bacon, Jeff Lansman, H. Clay Pauley, Darrel Mathiasen, and Robert D. Christensen serving as casketbearers.
