

Alfred "Fritz" Reinig, 77

— Alfred G. "Fritz" Reinig, 77, of Overland Park, KS died Tuesday, August 17, 2010, at Kansas City Hospice House. Funeral services were held at Curé of Ars Catholic Church, Leawood, KS on Friday, August 27, 2010, at 10:30 a.m. with Rev. Joseph A. Miksch officiating. Visitation was held Thursday, August 26, 2010, at 6:30 p.m. with rosary at 7:30 p.m. at Curé of Ars Catholic Church. Private burial took place at Leavenworth National Cemetery.

Fritz was born July 30, 1933 in Panama to August and Mary (Kenkel) Reinig. His family moved to a farm near Portsmouth and he attended St. Mary's School graduating with the class of 1951.



September 28, 1957 Fritz was united in marriage to Mary Elizabeth "Betty" Miksch at St. Joseph's Church in Platte Center, NE. He worked for Union Pacific Railroad in the Omaha shops as a machinist and later as a foreman working on steam and diesel locomotives. He spent two years in the US Army with Battery A 510th Field Artillery Battalion serving time in Salzburg, Austria. In 1976 Fritz went to work for the Federal Railroad Administration in the St. Louis office as Railroad Motive Power and Equipment Safety Inspector. In 1977 he transferred to the Des Moines office and in 1990 he took the position of Principal Regional Inspector in Omaha, NE. He covered the railroads in Iowa and Nebraska until retiring in 1997. In 2002, Fritz moved to Overland Park, KS to be near children and grandchildren. Fritz was a member of Curé of Ars Catholic Church in Leawood, KS, the Knights of Columbus, the American Legion and the VFW.

Fritz is survived by his wife, Betty, four sons and their spouses, August and Kathleen Reinig of Hudson, NH; Mark and Brenda Reinig of Lee's Summit, MO; Max and Michelle Reinig of Overland Park, KS; Bruce and Jeannette Reinig of San Diego, CA; two daughters and their spouses, Barbara and Don Mundy of Raytown, MO; Mary and Ken Pyle of Lenexa, KS; and eighteen grandchildren.
