

Genevieve I. Schwery, 75

July 5, 1926 - May 6, 2002

HOUSTON, TX – Genevieve Irene Schwery was born to Dolores (Egan) and Joseph Assmann July 5, 1926, on a farm near Dunlap. She was baptized and confirmed at St. Patrick's Catholic Church in Dunlap. She attended school in Dunlap, and was a graduate of Dunlap High School.

April 24, 1946, she married Alphonse Tremel at St. Patrick's in Dunlap. To this union five children were born. They made their home on a farm near Panama, and were members of St. Mary of the Assumption Catholic Church in Panama. After farming for 15 years, Alphonse died Dec. 26, 1961. In the fall of 1962, Genevieve moved into Panama. She entered beauty school, and upon completion, opened her own shop, "Gen's Beauty Shoppe" in Panama, which she operated for 21 years.

Feb. 7, 1970, she married Gregory Schwery at St. Mary of the Assumption Catholic Church in Panama. In 1984, Genevieve and Gregory moved to Houston, TX, where she was employed as office manager for AHC Contracting. She was still employed at the time of her death. She died May 6, 2002, at Memorial Hermann Memorial City Hospital in Houston, TX, at age 75 years, 10 months and two days.

In addition to her parents and her husband, Alphonse, she was preceded in death by one brother, Arthur Assmann. She is survived by her husband, Gregory Schwery of Houston, TX; her children, Mary Jo (Jack) Vinson of Houston, TX; Patsy (Steve) Nowatzke of Omaha, NE; Janet (Ralph) Gingell of Houston, TX; Terry Tremel (Sandy) of Houston, TX and Thomas A.
